Second are those "ad hoc" who rise to the occasion and fill out the ranks. Third are those who "go with the flow". This is not a criticism. It's the way the world seems to work. I mention this as I want to thank all those "ad hoc" who filled out the various committees and stepped up to the plate when they were needed. *Everyone did a great job! Thank you!*

As you may know "ad hoc" comes from the Latin "to this" or for a special purpose only. I am sure the board is hoping that some of these people will step up to a board position as club elections approach. I know I am.

This issue's Conclave 2008 article has become an unintended eulogy to Ron Phillips, whom I heard just passed away. Our thoughts and prayers go out to Le Rae and family.

Conclave 2008, San Diego

Wow! What a great meet! Everything seemed to work. Let's look at some of the really good things about it!



First, we really owe the San Diego Club a terrific round of applause. Their organization and application of lessons learned from previous Conclaves really stood out. The presentation of the events in notebook form was simply the very best way I've ever seen

to present all the meet information for helping the participants understand each event and participate in it. Each day was documented with a discussion of the day's events, the time frames, and both maps and satellite views of each venue. All of these events ran on time, did not overrun the allotted time, and the venues chosen for each just couldn't have been better. Let's look at the venues a bit more closely.

The car show at Embarcadero Marina Park North, adjacent to Seaport village, was just

about as perfect a place for this event that I've ever experienced. Possibly only Pebble Beach could top it! And the weather just couldn't have been better, temps in the low 70's with clear blue skies just added to the beauty of this unique site by San Diego Bay. There were scenic backdrops of City skyline and boaters on the bay that just added to the drama of our cars no matter which way you took that prized picture of your pride and joy. Bob Segui's posing of everyone for a picture of them in their car as they entered the park for the car show featured a backdrop of the City skyline with the bay, boats, and marina framing each of our prized Healeys. Simply tremendous! Having the awards for the popular judging right at the venue worked superbly allowing for a drive

by to receive their awards for all the first place in class. This also removed this "burden" from the closing banquet, a great idea that was also used in Vermont, last year. This concept should become a tradition in the coming years.

The Funkanna and the Gymkanna held at Qualcomm Stadium was just perfect for this event. Having experienced people set up the Gymkanna course and run the equipment, made this event run as smoothly as any of this type I've ever

seen. The course was in an enclosed area West of the Stadium and we had it all to ourselves without the possibility of non-participants wandering through it! Where in the last few years there seemed to always be "issues" with this event, here we had an entire over one mile long course that ran slightly uphill and then back down to the finish. And there was covered shade for all the participants to view the action courtesy of the light rail transportation system that serves the Stadium. From that shade offered by the overhead tracks, you never lost sight of the cars on the course due to the up-hill nature of it, was simply terrific! And what drama to watch the mix of cars, both

our Healeys and the local Gymkanna group's much "hotter" cars navigate the course. This professional course and management of it allowed each participant up to three or more practice sessions with three or more speed runs, depending on whether you wanted to just keep looping the course, or not. There was no hurry as the organizers could run multiple cars on the course at one time and not have to wait for each car to finish before the next one could start, a real time saver for this event. As Gymkanna's go, it just doesn't get any better than this! Take a look at the times and you will see that a lot of people had a great time running this course.


The Funkanna, conveniently located on the other side of the shaded area, gave an opportunity for anyone to participate

as driver or navigator during the day. The path of travel was clearly marked on pavement. No confusion, nothing dangerous, just fun!

About the food. The closing banquet held at the Sheraton was the absolute best mass served meal I've ever had. Everyone else seemed to feel the same way. The combination dinner of Salmon and Chicken cooked perfectly and tasted delicious. How did they pull this off? The food was hot, served with great presentation, and considering that all meal service came from the other Sheraton tower, was a great accomplishment on the part of the Hotel.

evening without concern for driving after a brew or two.

And I really have to mention the marina deli just at the end of the parking lot. I'd bet that every attendee of Conclave had at least one meal there! Sprite Award For Gerry Coker Co-Sponsored By The Austin- Healey Club of San Diego

Gerry Coker, the body designer for the Austin-Healey and the Sprite was presented a beautiful 1/18 scale die-cast model of the first prototype Sprite at the recent Conclave in San Diego, CA organized by the AHCSD. The metal model was planned by Bill Meade, built by Andy Rowland and equally sponsored by The Austin-Healey Club San Diego, The Austin-Healey Sports and Touring Club, The Austin-Healey Club of America, The Austin-Healey Club USA and The Golden Gate Austin-Healey Club.

This one-of-a-kind model car was of the Sprite Gerry originally designed with recessed headlights and a forward sloping grille. This original car had an aggressive, race car look, which was lost when BMC decided to install the less expensive "bug-eye" headlights and an upright grille.

The original prototype was actually built as a running car and finished in "Ferrari" red at Gerry's suggestion. Bic Healey recently said he was not sure what happened to the prototype car but he felt the front shroud was probably destroyed when the decision was made to use the "bug-eye" style front end. Gerry saw the prototype in its red finish just before immigrating to his new home in the US in 1957. He didn't know the appearance of the car had been drastically changed until he later saw the production car shown in a US dealership.

When the bug-eye Sprite was first introduced, it received much criticism from the public and press because of the funny, bulging headlights. However, after fifty years of seeing the bug-eye Sprites on the road, people have come to enjoy its quirky, smiling face. However, had the car been produced with the more racy styled front shroud, it probably would have greatly increased its original sales and its reputation today as an outstanding, classic sports car design.

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This close-up photo shows the racy good looks of the original prototype design reproduced exactly in this 1/18 scale model. The grille was lowered in height by a couple of inches and sloped forward at the top about 4 inches.


Greetings Mike,

After 1 hour and 43 minutes we arrived at the end which was the Bernardo Winery for lunch and results.



Ron Phillips and I joined the Austin Healey Association at about the same time. I no longer remember if he was a couple months ahead of me or if I joined first, but I do remember the first conversation we had where we discovered that we were both "newbies". We were both learning about our cars, what made them run and how to keep them running, and about the history and lore that came with them.

I learned what I needed to and a bit more but Ron took it to a whole "nuther level". He studied the car, the history, and the people involved until he was one of the most informed people on the subject anywhere.

I sometimes thought that he had memorized the entire Healey parts book. He could look at what to most people would be a rusted piece of junk, and tell you what it was, its function, what Healey or Healeys it fit and, incredibly, often the Healey factory part number as well.

In my younger days I accumulated, mostly legally, a huge mountain of used Healey parts. It was an enormous collection of stuff, a lot of which was unidentifiable to me. There came a time when Ron was between jobs and had some time to spare so I engaged him to help me identify this monstrous mess. He not only identified all the parts, not all of which turns out were Healey, but he categorized, organized, and computerized them. He presented me with a spreadsheet showing what was there, what it fit and his evaluation of its serviceability. Not many people could have done that. Even fewer would have.



Ron didn't keep all his knowledge to himself. He was always willing to share his expertise. Many times, probably too many times, I would call him and say, "Ron, I have this problem..." I can picture him rolling his eyes and saying, "What now?" Then he would tell me what I needed to know. Sometimes I could have looked up the information myself, but it was so much easier to just ask Ron.

He was always willing to get his hands dirty helping a stranded Healey owner get his car back on the road. I can't count how many times at Healey Weeks, Ron would hold an impromptu parking lot tech session to get someone's Healey healthy again. He also conducted scheduled tech sessions to

share his knowledge with the rest of us. I can remember one CHW when I was having carburetor troubles with my BT7 (yes I actually drove it to San Diego), and Ron discovered that one thing wrong was that the front carb had an extra float valve!

Although Ron was thoroughly immersed in them, his world did not revolve around Healeys. His world and in Ron's mind the universe, was centered on his wife, LeRae. And that is a good thing.

He was a good man, a devoted husband and father, and a great friend.

I will miss him. A lot.

British Car Day & Rolling B.C.D. 10 pts, Other non-AHCSO one-day events 2 pts, Other non-AHCSO multi-day events 4 pts, The Board on a case-by-case basis may award points for other events.

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


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
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
