


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From The Editor:

I'll get more information out closer to the event. Please pass this info on to others who have vintage or classic British cars (or motorbikes).



Driving without insurance not only unwise, but illegal

State-sponsored program makes auto insurance affordable

Are you breaking the law and don't even know it? The California Compulsory Financial Responsibility Law requires every driver and every owner of a motor vehicle to maintain liability insurance at all times.

- Have your current vehicle registration suspended
- Have your driver's license suspended
- Have your car impounded
- Face \$800 in total fines and court fees, if you are cited for not having insurance at the time of a traffic stop

Drivers cited for not having insurance at a time of an accident will receive a mandatory driver license suspension, followed by three additional years of being required to maintain proof of financial responsibility on file with California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV).

Think about it...If your vehicle's registration is suspended, your sticker on your car may appear to be current, but when you're stopped by law enforcement officers your car is likely to be impounded for not having insurance or valid registration. Would anyone want that?

Auto insurance can be expensive, but if you qualify for the California Low Cost Auto Insurance Program, your annual premium could be \$347 or less!
