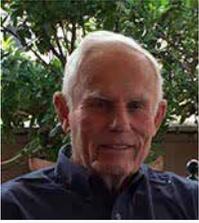

From The Editor:



I had an occasion to have my Healey's steering wheel re-centered, from a previous front end re-build and alignment. The alignment part was done by Roger Danials Brake and Alignment, in Santee, (619)562-7969, whom I highly recommend for this kind of work. Roger is very detailed and professional. When my Healey came off the assembly line in 1965-6, the toe-in was set at two degrees, which was factory spec for Healeys when they were born. While having Heritage Motorsports change the Healey's oil, Randy noticed that there was outside wear on the front tires. As these Coker/Michelin tires were an over the top splurge, I had to solve this ASAP. I had the tires rotated front to back and headed back to Roger Danials to find the problem. The front end was checked and the alignment was in spec at 2 degrees toe in. Roger re-set the alignment at zero/zero. The problem seems to be that when Healeys were young, most tires were bias-ply, hence the two degrees toe-in. This does not apply to, at least, some modern radial tires. As these are my second set of Coker radials, I had the front end aligned when the first set was installed, years ago. At that time the front end was set zero-zero for those tires, and I must have forgotten it, as they wore perfectly...

In addition, as these are specialty tires, they lived in Coker's warehouse for about eighteen months before I adopted them. This means I have lost that tire life that would allow a flat to be fixed at a licensed repair shop. I didn't know that when I purchased them. A tire's birth date is on every tire manufactured. Let the buyer beware...of everything with tires, as the saying goes...

I just received my new steering wheel from Mike Lambert. My Moto-Lita wheel was chipping on the plywood end grain and I couldn't stop it. I didn't understand that the problem was the plywood itself. So, I went for the best. Lambert's wheels, constructed like the original Darrington wheels, are works of art.




Lou will add Octoberfest to the October event calendar and Howard will review the calendars that were handed out at this meeting and provide a summary to Lou.



CAR OF THE YEAR (COTY) AWARD

The participant is responsible for providing proof of participation (entrance fee receipt, photo, corroboration from other club members etc.) to the COTY Recorder, Rick Snover (619-980-4194 ricksnover@earthlink.net) within 30 days after the event. AHCSO events will have a sign-in sheet that will be forwarded to the recorder. For members with multiple eligible vehicles, be sure to indicate which one(s) you drove.

COTY points currently approved by the Board are: AHCSO Meetings & Tech Sessions 4pts; AHCSO Driving Events, Parties, etc. 6pts; AHCSO Healeys on the Green 8pts; California Healey Week, Healey Rendezvous and Austin Healey Conclave 16pts; S.D. British Car Day and Rolling B.C.D. 10pts; other multi-day British-themed events 8pts; other multi-day events 4pts; other one-day British-themed events 4pts; other one-day events 2pts. Other non-Healey British-built cars earn half points, but are not eligible to win the award.

All points received during the year by all members will be worth a discount towards the purchase of AHCSO regalia during the subsequent year. The total point leader at the end of the year will receive the coveted CAR OF THE YEAR badge for display on their Healey for the following year.
