

AHCS D May 10, 2023 Meeting

President Don Benke called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm

There were 24 members in attendance: Joan & Bob DeYoung, Robert & Kathleen Reid, John Lee (H), Ed & Sandy Matheus, Lex Dunn, Richard & Ada Stevens, John McCoy, Laura & Terrey Leyland (H), Don Benke (H), Lou Galper & Deborah Durham (O), Capt Dave (H), Howard & Lynne Stark, Rick & Allie Snover (H), Terry Cowan (H) and Sandy & Lily Leon.

Don Benke reported and brought forth the following: He welcomed the members in attendance. A motion was made and passed to approve the meeting minutes from April's meeting, noting that they were late in arrival. He also gave an update on the groundwork being laid for updating the club's website. A committee (Laura & Terrey Leyland, John Lee, Ed Mathius, Rick Snover) met via a Zoom meeting to discuss wants and needs for a more useful website. They have 2 people who will provide an estimate of charges for the work to be done. We will be using the same web address, and hope to be able to make updates to the webpage in house, as opposed to continuing to pay someone from outside the club. It was suggested that members would be able to vote on any allocation of budget for this project.

John Lee: Membership report – Relayed that he had invited 2 parties that were interested in joining the club to attend the meeting, however they were not in attendance this month. This year's membership drive is almost complete with a few late renewals. We should expect that an updated membership roster will be available soon. Rick Stover reported that he could send out a link to members with a printable list and Lynne Stark said that she would also make printed copies. There was a discussion about waiving membership fees for long time more senior members who are interested in club updates.

Lynne Stark: Regalia update – The vinyl decals/logos have been received. There are 20 sets of white and 10 sets of black (small logo for front pocket/AH wings logo on back). In order to work around the difficulty she's been having finding shirts from a vendor without having to buy too many, Lynne asked that anyone who would like to purchase should procure their desired shirt, wash it, and then bring it to Lynne and she will have the logos attached. Don suggested that any regalia that we currently have on hand could be inventoried and photographed to be included in the Healey Hearsay. This would give members a better idea of what might be available. Terry Cowan reported that he has some boxes of AH items that could be included.

Sandy Leon: Treasure's report – The AHCS D remains solvent with a fund in the bank. Our club recently received \$120 from the national club for local members who joined the national club directly.

Laura Leyland: Activity report – Laura updated the members on upcoming planned events, including a drive to Ramona for a picnic and wine tasting (May), a drive to Campo for a museum visit and train ride (June), a Saturday/daytime club meeting and party (July), Cruising Grand in Escondido featuring British cars & British Car Day at Tideland's Park (August). California Healey Week in Lake Tahoe is happening September 18-22 this year. Members who plan on attending could possibly arrange to drive in a 2-day caravan, stopping in Bishop overnight before heading to Tahoe. There was a discussion of a tech session to assist members in car prep ahead of this week.

Ed Matheus shared information regarding the Temecula Car Show which he had just attended. He highly encourages others to register for next year's event to be held May 3-4, 2024. He will remind others when registration opens up in January.

Laura Leyland would like to add a members' page to the Healey Hearsay. In order to foster greater member participation in club communications, members are HIGHLY encouraged to send in pictures they may take while out and about in their cars, including just a caption or brief paragraph describing any related news and information that other members would enjoy seeing and reading about. 

CAR OF THE YEAR (COTY) AWARD

To recognize Club members who participate with their Healeys, the Austin Healey Club of San Diego awards CAR OF THE YEAR (COTY) points for various activities. Opportunities to collect COTY points include any car-related events (shows, drives, rallies, etc.) sponsored by an official organization (other car clubs, auto museum, city chambers of commerce, charities, etc.) where you participate with your Healey. Events need not be listed in the Club's newsletter to earn points.

The participant is responsible for providing proof of participation (entrance fee receipt, photo, corroboration from other club members etc.) to the COTY Recorder, Rick Snover (619) 980-4194 smokey.snover@gmail.com within 30 days after the event. AHCSO events will have a sign-in sheet that will be forwarded to the recorder. For members with multiple eligible vehicles, be sure to indicate which one(s) you drove.

COTY points currently approved by the Board are:

- AHCSO Meetings & Tech Sessions 4pts
- AHCSO Driving Events, Parties, etc. 6pts
- AHCSO Healeys on the Green 8pts
- California Healey Week, Healey Rendezvous and Austin Healey Conclave 16pts
- S.D. British Car Day and Rolling B.C.D. 10pts
- Other multi-day British-themed events 8pts
- Other multi-day events 4pts
- Other one-day British-themed events 4pts
- Other one-day events 2pts.
- Other non-Healey, British-built cars earn half points, but are not eligible to win the award.

All points received during the year by all members will be worth a discount towards the purchase of AHCSO regalia during the subsequent year. The total point leader at the end of the year will receive the coveted CAR OF THE YEAR badge for display on their Healey for the following year.



MY LED'S WERE DRIVING ME OFF THE ROAD...AND NUTS!


I have had an ongoing problem with my LED head-light conversion since Nathan and I installed them on..... The problem is they would blink on and off while driving at night. And it was driving me nuts trying to find the problem. My first thought was a loose connection, somewhere in the wiring. I went over all the looms several times. I checked the all connections and the ground at the outside of the right fender well. Everything looked as it should. I even replaced the left head lights pig-tale as it looked shaky. The problem persisted. Thinking I must have overlooked something, I repeated the process.

I was beginning to feel somewhat guilty as I believe several Club members had converted their cars after they saw mine. The installation made a great deal of difference for me as the ambient light levels are low on Dehesa Road to my home. The casino traffic has an increasing number of vehicles with LED head lights that overpowered my old technology Halogen H4's to the point I could not see the road around oncoming traffic. I could easily hit an animal, or perhaps a person walking along the left side of the road with their back, or tail to me...

I went on line to the STELLA LUX Led Conversion site and found... NOTHING. Everyone loves them.

Out of desperation, I drove over to Broadway Auto Electric in Lemon Grove. They did a cursory check of connections, found one that seemed a little loose, for no charge. Everything seemed fine. Drove my Healey to my son Nathan's home in Alpine and the problem persisted. By now, my light problem has been with me for going on three months...What in the heck am I going to do?...

Out of desperation, I called Udo Putzke with my problem. You may remember I did an article, about two years ago on his LED installation. It's where I got the informa-



tion to install my LED's.

Udo was right. I had a bad ground... (for LED's). I removed the ground screw in the fender well (behind the steel gas line) by the front SU and swabbed the contact spot with acetone dipped cotton Q-Tips. (be sure to cover the fender).

SO, if your new LED's flicker on and off, by all means, check all connections...and... don't forget LEDs are sensitive to a good ground connection...
