AHCSD May 8, 2024 Meeting

President Laura Leyland called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm

There were 18 members in attendance: Don Benke, John Lee, Howard Stark (H), Alex Watt, Sandy Leon, Robert & Kathleen Reid, Joan & Bob DeYoung (H), Terrey & Laura Leyland (H), Jim Doornink, Ed & Sandy Matheus, Tom Luckie (H), John Banales (H), Lou Galper (O), and Terry Cowan (H)

Laura Leyland opened the meeting and welcomed participants.

Old Business: Minutes from the April meeting were approved. Update on website redesign: Kathleen Reid agreed to act as a liaison between AHCSD and the web developer. John Lee and Kathleen will meet to exchange necessary information to facilitate this action.

New Business:

California Healey Week is right around the corner. Terry Cowan will be trailering his car to Healey Week. An informal poll was taken among those in attendance and no other members indicated they would also be there.

General discussion regarding keeping Club of America dues separate from AHCSD club dues. Processing is easier and it is more efficient to have members pay each entity rather than collect locally and then forward to the national club. Club Express increased this difficulty as well as having different due dates for membership. Don Benke is our delegate to the national club which entails attending a few meetings online, listening to upcoming plans (Conclave, etc.) and then passing along this information to the local club. Discussion included questions regarding the necessity of keeping AHCSD as part of the national club. It was suggested that we look at the pros and cons of what benefit the club receives as part of the national club. National Club offers insurance to our local club for AHCSD sponsored events, but our local club has not been sponsoring events. It was suggested to ask Don Benke to request a copy of the coverage that is provided via this policy. This information might make a difference in how the club may chose to proceed. Individual membership in the national club would still include Healey Marque magazine and a yearly calendar.

Membership update: John Lee suggested improvements to our own club renewal process which would include mailing out reminders and including a self-addressed return envelope to streamline the process. John also recognized members with May birthdays and anniversaries. He is also trying to schedule our upcoming meeting up to 3 months in advance to help members with planning. This information is included in the Healey Hearsay.

Treasury Update: Sandy Leon reported that the club remains solvent.

Activities Update: Laura Leyland outlined upcoming club events that include a wine tour in June, a Pt. Loma tour in July, Breakfast by the Bay and Ladies Luncheon (8/19) in August, and British Car Day in October (10/6). We are looking into British Car night for Cruising Grand in Escondido as well.

There will be a memorial service for former member Mickey Pleasant in Carlsbad on June 22nd. We are hoping to have current members meet and drive to the services to honor his memory and longtime participation on AHCSD. More information to come.

Vancouver BC Run By Robert Wilson

At the time I wasn't sure on what Healey to drive for the 800 mile trip. A proven Sprite or the latest BN6 I bought on a whim a year earlier. I had not many test miles on the BN6 and only bought for 15K online because it was in my budget. I later offered it on Bring a Trailer where there was commit that it looked 'glued together'. It didn't sell with a top bid of 25K. Over the winter I drove it as much as possible for test to fail, yet nothing failed. I decided the car was ready enough yet I was still a little nervous about completing the trip. My plan was to go alone because I don't mind being broke down on the side of the road but a buddy or my wife might. Less pressure more adventure. I also decided to leave a day early and just make it about 110 miles north on I-5 to Portland and stay at past president of the AHCUSA Mark Schneider house. Dudley Haynes also past president was there as well. Since I'm also a past President we were peas in a pod. Leaving early gave me 100 mile test run.

The Healey made it without any issues and this really set the stage of a worry free trip. I should also mention that my BN6 is a BN7 Spec right hand drive rally car replica. Installing racing numbers on the doors means I have to be in the fast lane. The next morning the plan was to meet up with 5 Healeys from the Portland area. Form there we stayed on I-5 for the next 100 plus miles until hitting 101 to Port Angeles where a hotel next to the ferry was our stop for the night. All was good until a rain storm approached. Glad I threw a top in the car at the last minute. I put it up and glad I did as it rained the rest of the trip North. My rally car features a stage one weight reduction package. That includes no weatherstripping or heater. Rain was pretty heavy and water start pouring in on my legs and on the back side of the dash. Small things as the engine was purring loudly as a whole in muffler makes my Healey sound mean rally car remember. Finally my wiper motor froze with the wipers in the upright position. Finally we made it to the hotel at the dock. Dudley had some reservation issues so he roomed with me up again for the second night in row. Good thing I like the guy.

The next morning we all lined up for the ferry to BC. I think about 15-20 Healeys were on the ferry and luckily the rain stopped. One Healey was being pushed through customs. I can't help to go over and be of help when a Healey bonnet is up. I don't think I'm alone as there was about ten others around me and every one had opinions about why this Healey quit. The engine actually ran good when but would quit under power, but being stationary it seemed fine. Anyhow we all boarded the ferry for the hour long voyage to BC. All my navigational tools were not working once in Canada so I just needed to follow someone who knows where they are going. Sounds easy right. Wrong. That fellow with the Healey that had trouble was in front of me and I spent the next couple of hours pushing his Healey through downtown B.C. I finally suggested he obtain a tow truck instead of my legs. I was able to follow another Healey for the hour long journey to the Hotel for the meet. The first night was at VFW Legion and we all had a pretty good BBQ. It was great to see old friends and meet some new ones. A bunch from the Southern California club had come from Healey Week in San Louis Obisbo had shown up. They all had special badges and magnets on the doors for the well deserved praise. We had a pleasant tour and then everyone gathered back at the hotel for some more meet and greets.

The next day was the car show and concours. It was raining pretty hard and the show was about hour away at a Aero-Museum. That didn't stop many as it was quite the event. It did delay the concours judging as that was postponed. It was best to have
